# CLARE ELECTION.

## CLARE SESSIONS FOR REGISTERING £10 FREEHOLDERS.

(FROM OUR SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT.)

Ennis, June 4, 1829.

The registration of the freeholders this day, was conducted  
with more activity than yesterday. Messrs. William Greene,  
Cornelius O'Brien, Michael Green, and Charles Studdart,  
the Solicitors, used every exertion in raising objections to the  
claims of any persons they thought were to support Mr  
O'Connell. On the other hand, Mr. N. P. O'Gorman, as-  
sisted by Messrs. Richard Scott, Charles O'Connell, and  
Michael Cullinane, were very active in objecting to the claims  
of any Brunswick freeholder; and it must be allowed, that the  
ingenuity of Mr. Scott induced the Barrister on many occa-  
sions to give a certificate of qualification. Mr. Major, whose  
conduct has been generally admired, had Dr. Doyle's address  
before him on the bench, to which he very often referred, and  
read portions of it for such persons as seemed to waver in  
swearing to the value of their freeholds. The entire number  
registered as yet is only 64, and I think 54 of them will vote  
for Mr. O'Connell. We have no rumour here relative to a  
rival candidate, but from the circumstance of a law agent being  
engaged against him, it is certain there will be a contest, if  
at the termination of the registration, there can be any chance  
of success. A number of tall poplar and fir trees are planted  
at different avenues to the town, bearing green flags; and I  
understand similar monuments of popular feeling are to be seen  
through the country. Mr. Maurice O Connell arrived here  
to-day, about one o'clock.

## REGISTRY OF FREEHOLDS UNDER THE LATE ACT IN THE COUNTY DUBLIN.

The Assistant Barrister attended at Kilmainham,  
on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday last,  
to investigate the claims to register votes. 165  
persons served notices under the late act—of the  
above number twelve 10l., and twelve 20l. free-  
holders were registered *during the four days!!!* It  
perhaps may not be amiss to mention that eight were  
rejected for want of value in the freehold, or that the  
freehold was not worth the sum specified in the act;  
four more were rejected because the barony was not  
stated in the notice. The freeholders of the county  
of Dublin should not neglect the present opportu-  
nity of registering their votes; the sessions court will  
sit during the present week—they know not when  
they may be called on to exercise the elective  
franchise.
