There is a book, whose title I have not preserved, discussing the
Ordnance Survey notes taken by John O'Donovan and Eugene Curry in
connection with these earlier surveys. I have a few photo-
copies from that book, which has at page iv:

"In the Journal of the Royal Society of Antiquaries (1864-6),
Rev John O'Hanlon provided a comprehensive listing of the
topographical collections made by the Ordnance Survey in the
1830s and the 1840s. His list, along with a later summary
published by R. Dudley Edwards in *Analecta Hibernia* (1966),
is most important not least for indicating the existence of a
range of source materials other than the Letter and Name
books. O'Hanlon classied the Clare materials according to
twelve categories. The most relevant for this discussion are:
(1) Three volumes of Inquisitions primarily from the early
seventeenth century which were copied and examined to
provide authority for placenames... (3) The Antiquarian Letters
are in three volumes, although the third volume had few
letters consisting of John O'Donovan's accoun of the ancient
territories of Thomond and their relationship to the modern
parishes and baronies...
Much of the remaining material in O'Hanlon's list is concerned
with orthography and indexes but two collections are of
special value....number ix in O'Hanlon...for the period 1833
to 1838...has a very valuable list of freeholders for every Clare
barony with details on the location..."

The Donlon genealogy report

Robert M. Donlon

Bartholomew Donnellan, son of James, was born in 1844 at Kilmihil, Ireland. He married Johanna or Susan Coughlin in 1879. They immigrated in 1880 to the United States and settled in Cohoes, New York. Notes Thomas McNerney or McInerney was born in about 1801 in Tullyglass, Glin, Limerick, Ireland. He married Mary Enright in about 1835 and they had eight children. They emigrated in about 1860 and settled in New York. Thomas died 21 February 1882 in Cameron, Missouri. Descendants and relatives lived mainly in New York, Ohio, Kansas and Missouri.

The Curtin family originated in Ireland and was originally called MacCairteain. Laurence Curtin (ca. 1801-1894) was born in Knockbrack, County Limerick, Ireland. He married Mary Cotter and was the father of six children, one of whom was Cornelius C. Curtin (1843-1930). In about 1866 Cornelius immigrated to America and moved with another brother to Illinois. In 1874 he married Sarah M. Molohon (1857-1937) and they were the parents of ten children. Descendants live in Illinois and other parts of the United States.
